A Quarterly Snapshot

Personal Independence Services

From the time the first van rolls in with eager participants until the last van pulls away for the day, the Personal Independence Services (PI) program is a bevy of activity. The 125 people who attend PI are involved in all kinds of experiences that help them remain active, healthy, and engaged. One of those 125 individuals is a friendly young man, Matt Huston, whose enjoyment of the program is evident. Often, Matt can be found walking through the PI hallways, and telling his friends and staff members, "I'll come in everyday, if that's ok."

Each day Matt comes to PI, he joins his friends in a classroom that is designed specifically to meet their unique needs. With dimmed lights, less noise, and a space to spend some alone time, Matt is comfortable and better equipped to participate in activities. Before he started attending PI, Matt worked in HDC's workshop. As things changed in his life, he decided to join the PI group, which has been a very positive move for Matt.

Program Director Tiffany Sprague explains the PI program, "Our main focus is to help people be as independent as possible. As people's needs change, we adapt too, so we can be there to help and support them." That approach has led to the development of an autism room, as well as a group for individuals who, because of age and medical issues, prefer a less rigorous schedule.

While PI participants experience significant intellectual, physical, and/or medical challenges, everyone receives the assistance they need to attend classes and experience trips into the community. Instructors provide activities and experiences in areas of communication, social skills, community awareness, safety, domestic skills, and much more. Community trips to coffee shops, libraries, shopping malls, parks, and events are a daily occurrence. A nurse is on staff to assist with medications and tube feedings, and individuals can also receive physical and occupational therapy services.

"The days are busy, but we wouldn't have it any other way," says Sprague. "We are here for the participants and we'll do whatever we can to make their day."

Outcomes for the period October 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017

- Percentage of participants participating in community activities - 97%
- Percentage of participants participating in class activity - 100%
- Percentage of participants maintaining or making progress on their therapy goals - 100%
- Percentage of participants maintaining or making progress on their personal adjustment goals - 100%

HALL OF FAME AWARDS

Part of the evening was devoted to the installation of the 2017 Hall of Fame recipients. In its 24th year, the HDC Hall of Fame recognizes people, organizations and/or companies that have demonstrated outstanding commitment to enhancing the lives of individuals with disabilities.

INDIVIDUAL AWARD

William Davidson posthumously received the Hall of Fame Individual Award. Davidson played a key role on the HDC board of directors for many years. His contributions were inconspicuous, but nonetheless, significant. As a prominent attorney in the community, he was often called upon to provide advice and counsel to HDC. His guidance was always beneficial, and he helped HDC through situations by providing a valuable legal perspective.

"Although Bill is no longer with us, his impact and the benefits of his involvement continue today," said HDC board member Dan DeVries who submitted the Davidson nomination. The Davidson family recently made a donation to HDC for the purpose of erecting a flag pole and installing a landscaped area in the front of the Personal Independence building for all to enjoy.

Current HDC board member and Bill's son, Cam Davidson, was on hand to accept the Hall of Fame award.

VOLUNTEER AWARD

Al and Mary Hite were the Hall of Fame Volunteer Award recipients. The Hites have been involved with HDC for many

years as volunteers, donors, sponsors, and participants in HDC events. During Al's lifetime, he was a staple at the HANDS golf outing and auction fundraisers. Not only did he eagerly participate, he also sponsored the events through his company. Even after his death, Al continued to support HDC by making the center a beneficiary of his life insurance policy.

Mary Hite has also been deeply involved with HDC for many years. Mary is a former chair of the HANDS auction and volunteered at many other HANDS events during her time as a HANDS member. Mary was one of the HANDS members who was originally involved with the auction and started a tradition that has resulted in over \$1 million donated to HDC over the years. Mary continues to stay involved by making a donation of her famous cookies to the auction each year.

ORGANIZATION AWARD

Brittany's Gifts was the Hall of Fame Organization Award recipient. Brittany's Gifts is an organization started by Jeff and Linda Manders and their daughter Breanna, in memory of another daughter of theirs, Brittany. Brittany's Gifts is a unique concept where honor students from the three Davenport public high schools plan a variety of activities throughout the year to raise funds. Those funds are then used to support the two organizations that were closest to Brittany's heart, one of which is the HDC Residential Center.

For years, Brittany's Gifts has provided Christmas gifts for every resident at the Residential Center. After raising the money, the students shop for the gifts and then

deliver them to the Residential Center in December. They sing songs with the residents, play games with them, and spend some time getting to know them.

Brittany's Gifts has also provided birthday presents and has made generous donations to other important projects at HDC. While the stated purpose of Brittany's Gifts is to benefit the residents, the students who are involved receive a gift too. "Through their experience with Brittany's Gifts, the students receive something that is even more important than the gifts they give and it is something they will take with them throughout their lives," says Linda Gill, Vice President of ICF/ID Services and Brittany's Gifts nominator.

HANDS' PRESENTATION

Also on the agenda at the donor appreciation dinner was a check presentation from the HANDS Auxiliary. After a successful year of events, members of the HANDS group presented HDC board vice-chair Jonna Schuler with a check in the amount of \$91,000. "This check was made possible because people, many who are in this room, supported our trivia night, auction, and golf outing. We deeply appreciate all those who sponsored the events and took part in them in any way. You are making a difference in many lives at HDC," said Carrie Ott DeVine, HANDS President and newly-elected HDC board member.

One of the ways in which those funds will make a difference right away is with the purchase of some new adjustable beds for individuals at the HDC Residential Center. Many residents experience physical and

medical conditions that require the use of a bed that can elevate their head or feet. For some, it's a matter of comfort. For others, it's a medical necessity.

The new beds are adjustable, moveable and come with safety rails, but they also have head and footboards that help them look homier.

During their high school years, both Brooke and Paige Schuler were mentors for Sparkles, which is a group of students, some who experience a disability and some who do not. The students form integrated cheer and dance teams that promote acceptance and understanding. Jonna's daughters "learned lifelong lessons and formed lasting relationships" thanks to their involvement. When her former boss, Jeff Ashcraft, moved to his position of HDC President/CEO, Jonna offered to help in any way she could. "It sounds kind of funny, but I wanted to continue the legacy of my daughters," Jonna explained. "I could never have taught them all that they took away from that experience, and I thought maybe I could use what I saw them learn to help others in some way."

As a result of her offer to Ashcraft, Jonna was asked to serve on the HDC board and began her term in 2014. Jonna's impact was immediately felt as she became engaged in meetings, projects, and events. As a self-described newcomer, she enthusiastically brought fresh ideas and asked some new questions.
